Dear Sir,

I have the honor to be in receipt of your letter dated 20th. instant, file-548475, and in compliance to your request for further explanations in the matter of my statement filed in support of the claim to my homestead entry. I beg to state I am really sorry and feel almost dishartened to see that I am put to so much grievance in regard the matter, for I solemnly declare that in trying to fulfill my duties and obligations as homesteader of this land, was done with good faith by my part, in order to try and keep my land and to obtain a patent for the same. I did not think that I was obliged according to the Homestead Act, to build buildings on both the $\frac{1}{2}$ - $\frac{1}{4}$ S.N.M. and S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ - $\frac{1}{4}$ Section, so as to hold and be in the conformity of the law, but I am willing and ready to comply to your instructions towards fulfilling the requirements of the law, towards the matter.

Now in reference to the Homestead Inspector's report sent to the Department against me, I must say that I feel surprised, and vexed and would venture to say that his manner of acting towards me, in this case, leaves me under the impression to think that the Inspector is working to condemn me, so as to favor some of his friends, the reasons for which I say so, are these. The last time that I met him in Golden and he spoke to me about the matter, was sometime in the beginning of May last, and during our discussion over the matter, he stated to me that the statement filed by me and executed before Notary Public,

was

was not acceptable. So I went right away and brought the Notary Public in presence of the Homestead Inspector, and asked the Inspector to state before him his reasons why he should say that the statement made by me and executed by the Notary Public was not acceptable, but the Inspector made me reply, that it would be alright and then advised me to give him five dollars , or send the money to the Kamloops Dominion Lands Office, and that he or the Land Agent would enter my application to the Department for my patent, if I sent in the money any time to the Kamloops office in payment of the fees, as he said he expected not to be back to Kamloops before 13 or 14 days, and on his return to kamloops he would advise Mr. Nash the Land Agent for him to advise me, to apply for my patent, but I never received a word from him since, till receiving your letter.

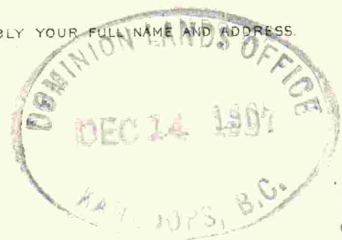

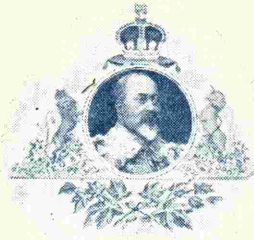
Sir,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 5th instant enclosing copy of letter received by you from Mr. Vachon, Golden, and to advise you that Mr. Vachon has only been living on his homestead three months in each year, and consequently the Department will not grant his patent until he complies with the regulations by living the required time on his homestead. x In reference to his complaint regarding his purchase, I beg to advise you that he made application to purchase 117 acres and this the Department has granted him, but he has not yet availed himself of the opportunity to purchase owing to the fact, as he claims, that it did not cover all the lands he required. He then made a second application for 28 acres, which has been referred to the Department for consideration, but to which I have not yet received a reply, and as the lands in his first application to purchase lie to the South of the Lake and the lands in his present application lie to the North of the Lake I cannot understand why the two would have any connection with the drainage scheme that Mr. Vachon claims to make so much of. You will note that the whole of the purchase amounts only to 145 acres, and as some of it is ~~outside of~~ the townsite of Golden I would consider the price, \$5.00 per acre, to be reasonable and am of the opinion that Mr. Vachon does not wish to avail himself of the present opportunity that there will be no difficulty in selling to other applicants.

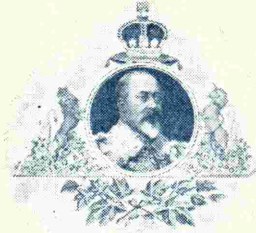

1. That he is refused a title to his homestead.
2. That he is compelled to pay at the rate of \$7.00 for submerged land, practically worthless, unless a large amount is expended in drainage and preventing the overflow from the Columbia river.

 700 per acre. The oversight referred to in

 gives is to me not very explicit, but you may
