- 4. All entries must be brought to the museum between 9 am and 10:00 am on Saturday, Sept 14, 2024.
- 5. All exhibitors must leave the building by 10:00 am sharp so the judging can take place.
- 6. All exhibits must be locally grown or completed in the last year.
- 7. All entries must remain for the duration of the Faire but must be removed promply at 5:00 pm. Organizers are not responsible for items not picked up at the appointed time.
- 8. An only entry in any one class will not necessarily be given a ribbon.
- 9. The Golden & District Historical Society, its officers, employees and members as well as its participating partners will not be responsible for any loss, damage or accident whatsoever in connection with the exhibits or property.
