5. All exhibitors must leave the building by 10:00 am sharp so the judging can take place.
6. All exhibits must be locally grown or completed in the last year.
7. All entries must remain for the duration of the Faire but must be removed promptly at 5:00 pm. Organizers are not responsible for items not picked up at the appointed time.
8. An only entry in any one class will not necessarily be given a ribbon.
